MINUTES December 17, 2019

CALL TO ORDER

The regularly scheduled meeting was called to order by Chairman Blackwell at 7:35 p.m. at the Pennington Firehouse, following adequate notice under the Open Public Meetings Law (annual notice published in the Times of Trenton and the Hopewell Valley News, filed with the municipal clerk, posted at the Pennington Borough Municipal Building and Board offices, posted on the fire district's web site and provided to any person requesting same in advance of the meeting).

ROLL CALL

Present by roll call were Commissioners Bill Meytrott, Mark Blackwell, Wayne Blauth, Bob DiFalco, Brian Hofacker (arrived late). Absent: None. Also present were Chief Gaudioso, LOSAP Rep. Hallock and Attorney Griswold.

PUBLIC COMMENT - None.

CHIEF'S REPORT

There were 41 calls in November, 2019: 6 of them in Pennington Borough, 28 in the Township, 3 in Hopewell Borough and 4 other. Calls included 1 residential, 1 non-residential; 3 auto/machinery, 2 motor vehicle incidents, 2 wires/transformer, 2 gas leak, 2 HazMat, and 1 CO calls. There were 14 accidental alarms/activations. Two scheduled drills were held.

One motor vehicle incident involved a rollover and another was a double car fire that extended into a residence. So far this month there has been another double car fire near the hospital and a vehicle fire near Suburban Wrench.

Operation Santa gift delivery begins this week. Fire Company elections were held; Jim DeForte will assume the position of Chief in January.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On a motion by Cmsr. Hofacker, seconded by Cmsr. DiFalco and passed, the minutes of the November 19, 2019 meeting were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT

A copy of the treasurer's report was made available to each Commissioner with a list and description of the bills to be paid. After certification that there are sufficient encumbered and unencumbered funds in the 2019 and prior year's budgets to pay the bills as presented, on a Motion by Cmsr. Meytrott, seconded by Cmsr. DiFalco and passed, **Resolution 2019-42** - Paying bills in the amount of \$40,388.24 was passed on roll call vote.

2020 BUDGET - PUBLIC HEARING and ADOPTION

On a motion by Cmsr. Blackwell, seconded by Cmsr. Meytrott and passed, the public hearing on the 2020 approved budget was opened. On a Motion by Cmsr. Meytrott, seconded by Cmsr. Di Falco and passed, **Resolution 2019-43** – Authorizing 2020 Fire District Budget be Read by Title was adopted.

After taxpayers of the fire district and all persons having an interest in the budget were given an opportunity to speak, and there being no comment, on a motion by Cmsr. Meytrott, seconded by Cmsr. DiFalco and passed, the public hearing was closed.

On a motion by Cmsr. Meytrott, seconded by Cmsr. Blauth and passed, the 2020 Fire District Budget was presented for adoption in the same content and amount as the approved budget. The estimated tax rate remains the same as last year - \$0.043 per \$100.00 assessed value. A synopsis is appended to these minutes.

- Pete Hallock reported that the board's account at Samsie's (now Gauls) lapsed when the business changed hands and, if desired, the board will have to apply for a new account.

Issuing a purchase order to MES for a Hurst replacement hydraulic hose reel (proprietary) to replace the one that burned out is approved – per only obtainable quote, price not to exceed \$4,655.00

Commissioner Hofacker arrived.

- Gear Dryer – Wearing contaminated turnout gear exposes firefighters to a higher risk of developing certain types of cancer than other workers. The sooner gear is cleaned to remove visible contaminants, like soot and blood, and invisible chemicals and compounds, like benzene, the sooner the risk of exposure to potentially harmful toxins and carcinogens is reduced. The gear dryer in the firehouse has a small load capacity and takes an inordinate period of time to fully dry gear, sometimes leaving responders unable to respond to the next call(s). After discussion and weighing alternatives a decision was made to replace it with a larger capacity gear dryer. On a Motion by Cmsr. Hofacker, seconded by Cmsr. DiFalco and passed, **Resolution 2019-47** – Authorizing the purchase of a large capacity (4 sets of gear) dryer at a cost not to exceed \$13,000.00 was passed.

Further, assorted electrical adjustments and vent work to accommodate the dryer and address other issues will be awarded to vendors submitting the lowest responsible quotes in an amount not to exceed \$11,000.00.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting adjourned at 8:53 p.m. The next regular meeting of the Board will be held at 7:30 p.m. on January 21, 2020.
