MINUTES January 18, 2022

CALL TO ORDER

The regularly scheduled remote 'Zoom' meeting was called to order by Chairman Blackwell at 7:30 p.m. following adequate and electronic notice under the Open Public Meetings Law and N.J.A.C. 5:39 (annual meeting notice including information on how the public could access and participate in the remote meeting, make public comment and where relevant documents, if any, would be made available published in the Times of Trenton (12/29/21) and Hopewell Valley News (1/07/22), provided to the Hopewell Express, sent to the Borough Clerk for filing and public posting and posted on the board's website, at the firehouse entrances and at board offices, as well as provided to any person requesting same in advance of the meeting.

ROLL CALL

Present by roll call were Commissioners Mark Blackwell, Robert DiFalco, Ryan Fraser, Brian Hofacker, Robert Ingram. Absent: None. Also present were Chief DeForte, Joe Carducci and Attorney Griswold.

LOSAP – Lt. Rodriguez had a schedule conflict but stopped in to report that the list of members qualifying for LOSAP contributions in 2021 will be presented at the next meeting for board approval and posting.

INSURANCE PRESENTATION – Kirk LeBlanc from the Nottingham Insurance Agency was present to answer questions from the board and to present an overview of the policies currently in place.

2022 BUDGET – **PUBLIC HEARING**

Motion by Blackwell and seconded by DiFalco, <u>Resolution 2022-01</u> – Authorizing the 2022 Fire District Budget be Read by Title was adopted.

Chairman Blackwell opened the public hearing on the 2022 approved budget. After taxpayers of the fire district and all persons having an interest in the budget were given an opportunity to speak, and there being no public present and no comment, the Chairman closed the hearing.

CHIEF'S REPORT

There were 34 calls in December, 2021: 7 in Pennington Borough, 16 in the Township, 1 in Hopewell Borough and 10 other. Calls included 2 residential, 1 motor vehicle/rescue, 2 brush, 1 gas leak, and 2 CO calls. There were 14 accidental alarms and 11 mutual aid calls. 4 scheduled drills were held.

The fire company responded to 508 calls throughout 2021.

- <u>Aerial</u> – Leak in foam tank; no update - 4 Lanes End to look at.

- <u>New Engine</u> (pumper) – Went back to Campbell Supply to deal with light tower warranty as well as a recall issue on the steering. Expected to be returned and back in service within the week. Additional minor issues still to be addressed.

- <u>Rescue</u> Hydraulic hose reel; waiting for Hurst representative to assess no update. Door switches; repair to be done by 4 Lanes End.
- <u>Tanker</u> Leak on transfer case 4 Lanes End to address.
 - (4 Lanes End technician has been out with an injury expected back to work soon)

Given the resurgence of Covid the fire company has reinstituted safety measures, including a return to remote meetings and limiting firehouse access to only those responding to emergency calls and performing necessary operational tasks.

The chief again expressed to this board, as he has to the township board, his ongoing concern with dispatching. It would save precious minutes (and perhaps lives) if the township would directly dispatch the local fire services, especially for smoke conditions and structure fires. Per current protocol 911 emergency calls go to the township. All fire calls are then relayed to Mercer County central dispatch for dissemination to the first responders. The time that elapses between the initial receipt of a call and its dispatch by the county is time wasted. In a recent incident it was more than 3 minutes. The township chiefs will meet to discuss the best way to initiate improvements to the system. Commissioner DiFalco asked the chief to put his concerns and the particulars of notable delays in writing.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Motioned by Hofacker and seconded by Fraser, **<u>Resolution 2022-02</u>** – Adoption of a temporary budget of \$ 57,885.00 and appropriation of \$103,460.00 for annual debt service on the aerial was passed by roll call vote.

A copy of the treasurer's report was made available to each Commissioner with a list and description of the bills to be paid. The Chief Financial Officer certified there were sufficient encumbered funds from a prior year's budget and/or funds in the 2022 temporary budget to pay the bills as presented. Motioned by Fraser and seconded by Ingram, **Resolution 2022-03** – Approving payment of the bills as presented in the amount of \$136,931.05, which amount includes annual debt service on the aerial, was adopted by roll call vote.

Cmsr. Blackwell stated his intent to be recorded as an abstention from any votes to approve payments throughout the year for bookkeeping services or to Metal Fab Pro Racing.

PUBLIC COMMENT - none

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes from the December 21, 2021 meeting will be held for approval at the next meeting.

- 2022 BUDGET - ADOPTION

Motion by Hofacker and seconded by Ingram, the 2022 Fire District Budget was presented for adoption in the same content and amount as the approved budget. The estimated tax rate is \$0.59 per \$100.00 assessed value. A synopsis is appended to these minutes.

Resolution 2022-04 – Adoption of 2022 Fire District Budget

On a motion by DiFalco, seconded by Fraser and passed, the following PO's were issued:

<u>#2022-01</u>- State mandated annual training courses, to be conducted remotely over 3 nights and 1 in-person session (to be held later date), from Alpha Omega (sole provider for this format) at a cost of \$3,275.00; chargeable to Training.

The training will be recorded for those who cannot attend (if allowed) and valley companies will be invited to participate if they choose.

<u>#2022-02</u> – Blower motor, resistor and exhaust repairs to Deputy Chief's vehicle from Al's Sunoco at a cost of \$720.00, chargeable to Vehicle Repairs.

<u>2022-08</u>: Appointment of Joseph Carducci of Bedard, Kurowicki & Co., as fire district auditor for the 2021 audit and LOSAP review, as professional service without competitive bidding.

<u>2022-09</u>: Appointment of Nottingham Insurance as the fire district's insurance broker of record.
